October 2, 2009 - Award recipients and principal nominators are notified of their selection.

November 5 2009 - Awards are presented during the MAF 2009 Florida Manufacturers Summit.

FLATE AWARDS - 2009

Manufacturing Post-Secondary Educator-of-the-Year Award:

The Post-Secondary Educator-of-the-Year Award recognizes a community college or Technical school educator for outstanding contributions to manufacturing and/or engineering technology education. Nominees for the award must have had a demonstrated impact on technology education on both a local and state level. Nominee publications that demonstrate significant contribution to manufacturing education with originality of ideas and techniques presented are strongly encouraged as supporting documentation. This award represents FLATE's commitment to support and recognize community college faculty who make significant contributions to the education and training of today's advanced manufacturing workforce.

Manufacturing Secondary Educator-of-the-Year Award:

The Secondary Educator-of-the-Year Award recognizes a high school educator for outstanding contributions to manufacturing and/or engineering technology education. Nominees for the award must have had a demonstrated impact on technology education on both a local and state level. This award represents FLATE's commitment to support and recognize secondary faculty who make significant contributions to the education and training of today's advanced manufacturing workforce.
